Pope Francis: Enter into the mystery.

At the Easter Vigil, when the Alleluia resounds again, we will celebrate the Risen Christ, the centre and fulfilment of the universe and history. At times the darkness of the night seems to penetrate into our souls; at times we think there is nothing left to do and our heart seems to have lost the strength to love. But it is in that very darkness that Christ lights up the fire of God's love: a flash of light breaks the darkness and announces a new beginning.
